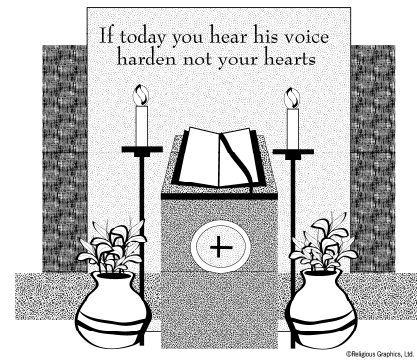

First Eucharist

FIRST EUCHARIST PARENT SESSION

This is the last opportunity to attend the First Eucharist Parent Session. The session will be offered on Thursday, February 9 at 5:30 p.m. at St. Philip's Social Hall. The session is for parents/guardians who will be preparing their child to receive the Sacrament of First Eucharist this year. This is a parent only Session, one parent must attend (both are welcome). Children preparing to receive the Sacrament should be in second grade or older and attending Religious Formation or St. Philip's School. An overview of the Sacrament, the preparation program and the time line will be discussed. **Parents/guardians are responsible for the preparation of their child to receive the Sacrament.** Packets will be handed out and there will be an opportunity for questions and discussion. LENTEN DISCIPLINE: PARISH-WIDE OPPORTUNITY

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on February 22nd. For the past month, the bulletin has had some preliminary information about a parish-wide opportunity of spiritual growth during Lent. Take a look at this quote from the late Holy Father, Blessed John Paul II, which is the inspiration behind this opportunity:

“Yes... our Christian communities must become *genuine "schools" of prayer*, where the meeting with Christ is expressed not just in imploring help but also in thanksgiving, praise, adoration, contemplation, listening and ardent devotion, until the heart truly "falls in love".”

- Blessed Pope John Paul II

Please take some time to pray about a way in which you can participate in the communal prayer life of our parish. The ultimate goal is that our parish will become a “genuine school of prayer.” The ministry staff is working to prepare an entire schedule of prayer opportunities which will begin in Lent but will continue beyond Lent. In this way, our Lenten discipline will not be a season, but a new beginning to a life of deeper commitment to prayer in the parish. Following the guidelines found within Bishop Hoepfner’s pastoral letter: *Meeting Christ - Living Christ*, included here is a list of opportunities you may want to consider signing up for:

At the parish:

- An individual hour of adoration each week (1hr/wk)
- A communal “parish holy hour” each week (1hr/wk)
- Daily praying of evening prayer (15min/day)
- Marian Devotions (30 min/wk)
- Arrive 30 min before Sunday Mass for confession and prepare for Mass (30 min/wk)
- Bringing your 5 – 10 year old to Children’s Adoration (30 min every other wk)

At home:

- Daily rosary with family (15min/day)
- Daily reading of Scripture / Mass readings (10 min/day)
- Daily prayer with family (10min/day)

Next week there will be:

- A fuller description of the above mentioned opportunities
- a weekly schedule so that you can see what this “School of Prayer” might look like in the parish

INVITATION WEEKEND FEBRUARY 18th AND 19th



Over the Christmas holiday, CATHOLICS COME HOME ran a number of commercials on major networks such as CBS, NBC, Univision, TBS, USA, TNT, CNN, FoxNews, etc. They aired these commercials over 400 times with a very simple and beautiful message inviting people to explore the Catholic Church.

On the weekend of February 18th/19th, Saint Philip's is having an *Invitation Weekend*. This is an opportunity / challenge for all parishioners to pray, identify and invite someone / some family to attend Mass with them that weekend. Here is an overview of what you can do to prepare for this weekend of welcoming, hospitality, invitation, and outreach to the city.

WEEK1:

Jan 28/29: Begin to **PRAY**, asking the Lord to show you some people whom you may want to invite to Mass. (someone who might be lonely; someone who may not have any religious background; someone who has been away from Church for awhile).

WEEK2:

Feb 4/5: Pray and begin to **IDENTIFY** who those people might be. If you have identified some people, pray and ask God how you may approach them, asking for humility and courage. Hopefully more than one person has come to mind in your prayer.

WEEK3:

Feb 11/12: **INVITE** that person to attend Mass with you next weekend. If that person says no or is unable, ask them if they would be interested another time. In the meantime, identify and ask the next person from your prayer list for *Invitation Weekend*.

WEEK4:

Feb 18/19: **ATTEND** Mass with those whom you invited. Enjoy Mass together and hospitality afterwards. If it leads to a meal out in the city or in your home, great! If there is an opportunity to invite them again for next weekend, great! Whatever happens, thank them for being so open to attending Mass with you. Let them know that you enjoyed seeing them and spending time with them and that they are always welcome at Saint Philip's.

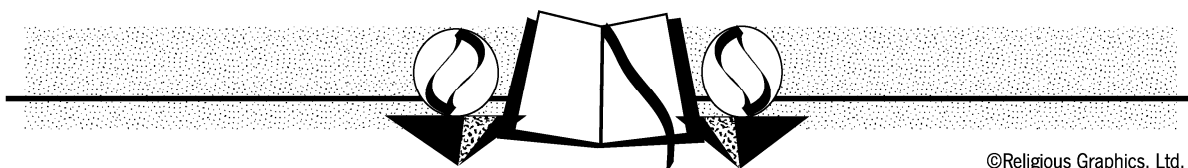
CLASS NOTES

**Why is the Church Supporting the
Marriage Amendment?**

Because of the critical role marriage plays in fostering the well-being of children and creating just social structures that strengthen civil society overall.

Given the inherent connection between families, the well-being of children and the good of society, it is natural that the state supports and endorses traditional marriage (one man and one woman) in its laws and state constitutions.

Civil marriage exists in U.S. law because marriage between one man and one woman provides the most stable environment in which to raise children and keeps biological parents connected to their children. While death and divorce too often prevent it, we know children do best when raised in an intact home by their mother and father. 
